The Stepping Stones Triple P (SSTP) Project aims to significantly reduce emotional and behavioural problems in children with a disability by providing evidence-based parenting help. The first step: a statewide survey The project's first step is to survey parents and professionals across NSW to benchmark child emotional and behaviour problems and parental wellbeing. Parents of children with a disability aged 2 to 10 are invited to go to www.mysay.org.au to complete the My Say survey and register their interest in free parenting support. Can you help us promote the project? Can you help the NSW project team promote the My Say survey by liking our Facebook page? We also have flyers and banners which can be emailed to parents and professionals to help spread the word. These will be attached to the next e-update to make this an easy job. Parenting under pressure A 2007 study found 71 per cent of children with a developmental disability showed substantial behaviour improvement after their parents completed a Stepping Stones program. This is good news for parents of children with special needs, who have three to four times more emotional and behavioural problems than typically developing children.
