Dear Parents, Carers, Staff and extended community, please join me in thanking our Principal Panel convened by our Director Jan Green for their service to our school. The successful candidate and **incoming Principal** is **Jo-Anne Gardiner**, currently substantive Principal at Sir Eric Woodward School. Miss Gardiner will commence duty in Week 3 of Term 2.

Parents, and Carers we would like to thank you for your patience with changes in classes and changes with staff as we seek to maintain a safe learning environment for all students. By the end of the term we expect a whole new class to be enrolled, which might mean more changes, however we will do our utmost to minimise changes. Where changes have occurred we strive to inform parents as soon as trial periods are finalised and all risks have been addressed.

We would like to thank our P&C for the donation towards the painting in the demountable eating area. I would like to thank Pauline (President of our P&C) and her husband Simon Lunn for their availability over a couple of weekends and supporting me in finding the correct ladders for the artist. During the period that the artist was at our school, Pauline and I agreed to ask the artist to paint another mural in the bike track. We are making a formal request for additional financial support for the murals, from both our P&C and Citizens Committee. The artist being from Northern NSW would have had significant difficulty in returning to finish the second mural. Our Director Jan Green, after seeing the murals gave her support to the installation of rotating pods in that area, adding another calming element to our SPA (Self-regulating Playground Area).

On that same weekend our 4 new teachers, Mr Christensen, Mrs Ngo, Miss Finn, Mr Prasad, along with Mrs De-Bourbon and Learning Support Officers, Ms Whatarau and Miss Bitz joined 18 teachers from other Special Schools in a TEACCH workshop, hosted by BGS. We would like to thank them for the dedication in giving up their Saturday to learn about TEACCH to better support our students.

In week 4, we made a vital investment in professional learning in which 3 of our new teachers, Mr Christensen, Mrs Ngo and Miss Finn P attended a 2 day Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) training. Their training followed in-class consultations with PECS trainer, Komala Kymes.

Our new students desks, purchased to support our TEACCH implementation across classes has been a great hit. It is providing our students with the privacy to independently engage in learning tasks aligned with their work systems.

Our assistive technology class (with a focus on eye gaze and switch work technology), formed this year, headed by Mrs Kell, is proving to be an outstanding tool for students who otherwise have very few opportunities to independently engage in digital learning opportunities. Keep up the great work Class Deer.

We have all been continuing or learning how to follow an individual work system to promote our independent skills
















Chipmunk class


Dolphin Class




Macaw Class
