## Principal's message

What a year! 2020 has been like no other, I don't think anyone of us could have imagined that our amazing country would have experienced such crisis one after the other. From devastating bushfires, followed by floods and on the back of these a pandemic. From face to face learning, to remote learning back to face to face learning, the resilience of BGS students, staff and community has been second to none.

I could not be prouder to be in Australia and the Principal of one of the best schools I've had the privilege of leading.

The human spirit was alive and well, as Australia overcame so many tragedies and human spirit was what I got to experience everyday arriving at work.

I work beside the most outstanding leaders, educators and support staff that not only teach and support the running of the school but truly care and they care for the whole student and this extends to their families.

This year was a lot about heart and we wholeheartedly met our milestones and student outcome successes. Each individual student achieved in what was essentially 40 weeks; just over 220 days. What was achieved in those days was nothing short of amazing.

Our successes this year were captured by the phrase 'Soaring to new heights' and our Presentation Days had a hot air balloon theme. To soar means more than just to fly; it means to rise swiftly, to feel the wind below you as you ride higher, higher, higher. Soaring suggests exhilaration and in 2020, BGS soared!

All BGS students would have received their reports home this week. I had so many proud principal moments reading each and every report. I congratulate every student on their successes. Please take the time to read with your child their achievements this Semester and celebrate with them all their hard work and achievements.

This year finalised our 2018-2020 school planning cycle and we move into our new 2021-2024 strategic directions. BGS listened to our community and staff through surveys and conversations for areas of school improvement and these have been explored and will drive school improvement and change over the next four years.

Our Face Book page regularly highlighted our school events and great learning and teaching. This year we held many events but unfortunately without the presence of our wider school community due to COVID-19, please know you were all with us in spirit. This year we engaged in and experienced some of our incursions digitally – digital connection rapidly become the new norm. Our students celebrated NAIDOC week with a Torrens Strait Islander dance and song group, Science Week took us under the water in the deep blue with hands on experiments and tactile experiences. Book week, we celebrated the love of words and literacy and it was a favourite where we all looked like we literally jumped off the page and so much fun was had. Our students and staff moved and grooved to Music Count us in and a very special musical experience with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. All of these wonderful fun and learning events beautifully aligned and grew our student's confidence across the curriculum.

Major school upgrades continued to be worked on and we finally made our gym equipment area in the front playground accessible by all by removing the bark and levelling the area with Softfall making it inclusive and safe. The additional murals in the demountable area added to the vibrance of this area and complimented the already existing waterfall mural in the Sensory Processing Area. We went with an Australiana theme and the murals are a huge hit – making the area come alive for fun and play. Additional play equipment went in and a new basket swing replaced the non-operational flying fox and what a hit! They all line up to have a go. This has been so successful that when we recently received a kind donation from Revesby Workers Club, an additional basket swing was purchased and will be installed next year. Another kind donation from the Trilogy Foundation supported the purchase of a new POD for our top playground. The POD swings are also a huge success and a source of fun and a safe space for self-regulation for our students. This will be installed

in January. Revesby Workers Club, through Club Grants NSW, generously donated 23 thousand dollars and this upgraded our sensory tent area.

This year we celebrated in true style for both our Year 12 and Year 6 graduating students. We will farewell eight graduating Year 12 students, Tanner, Jackie, Thao, An, Adrian, Erykah, Adam and Darell who are all ready for their next adventure and four graduating Year 6 students, Veronica, Dean, Caroline and Manny. Some are moving on and some will transition to year 7 at BGS. On behalf of the staff and community I say congratulations to these students – be brave, be bold and take your next path by storm!

I take this opportunity to give thanks to all who have contributed to our school community. The BGS School Council, The P&C and The Citizen's Committee and I take my hat off to our parents and carers. I also acknowledge the Shore boys. While COVID kept them from our weekly visits, they attended a few weeks back and continued to paint within the 'blue feet' project. This project supports our students to focus on staying with their class group, an important safety skill for when they go out in the community. Our community is built on respectful relationships that include all and promote the greater good and the best for our students – As our motto goes 'Working together to make a difference'.

This year we also farewell, Dean, Veronica and Kevin who are all moving on to new schools. You will be missed!

On the second last day of school our students and staff enjoyed a pizza party and another session of Wheelchair Basketball. Both were a smashing success and were kindly donated by the BGS P&C. On behalf of our students and staff, thank you!

BGS will welcome seven new kindergarten students in 2021 and at this stage three new students across grades. I look forward to updating you all in 2021 on our new enrolments, our staff movements and the new staff joining our team in 2021.

I would like to thank all our parents and carers for your unwavering commitment to your child's learning and our school. It is a privilege to work with your wonderful children. I take this opportunity to say to the outstanding BGS staff, you deserve the best holiday break. Your passion, commitment and ongoing pursuit for the best for each student is nothing less than remarkable. 




